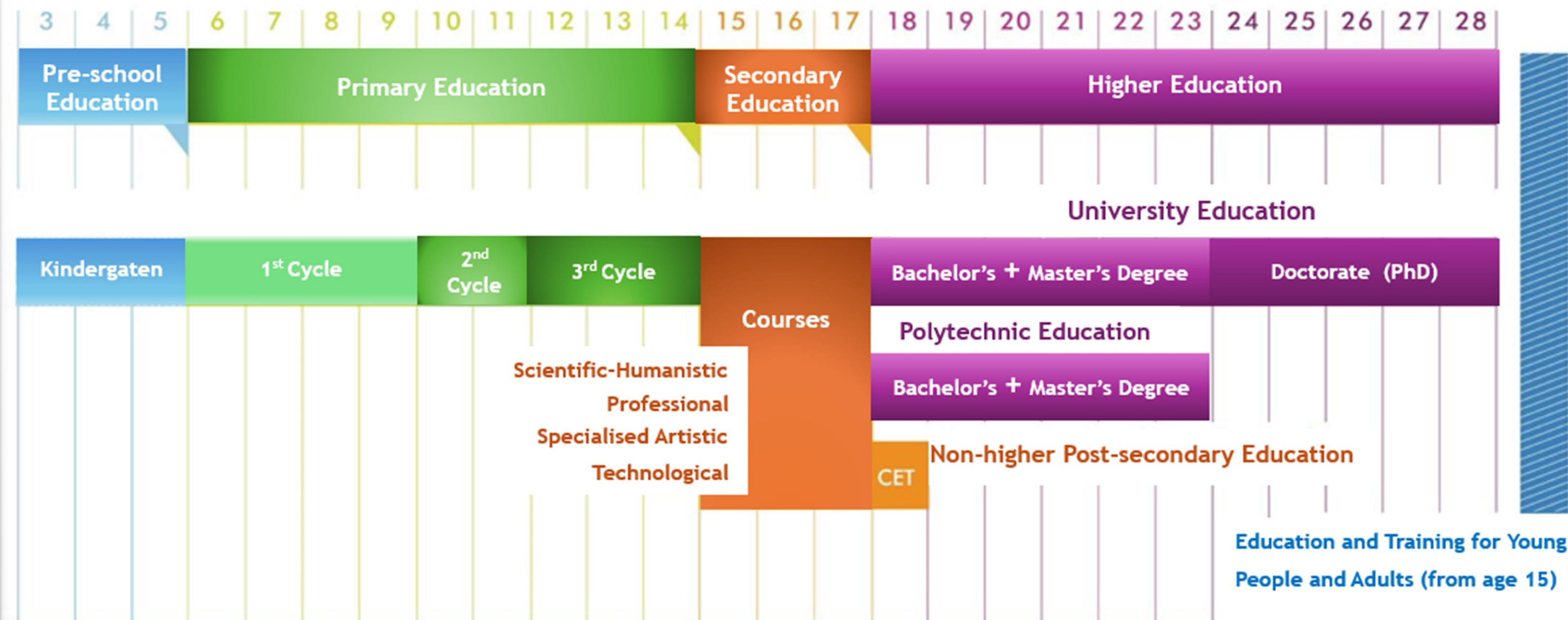

The Portuguese Education System



Pre-school Education

Pre-school education is optional and aimed at children between the ages of 3 and 6. It is funded and promoted by the state, supported by private organisations, cooperatives, private social solidarity institutions and non-profit institutions.

Primary Education

Basic education is part of compulsory schooling and aims to ensure a common education for all pupils in order to acquire knowledge that will serve as a basis for future educational stages.

It is structured into three sequential cycles, organised as follows:

- 1st Cycle: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th years
- 2nd Cycle: 5th and 6th grades
- 3rd Cycle: 7th, 8th and 9th grades

Secondary Education

Secondary education is compulsory until the age of 18 and comprises a cycle of three years (10th, 11th and 12th), towards two possible paths: further studies and dual certification courses.

Non-higher Post-secondary Education

Post-secondary education with technological specialisation courses (CET) and professional higher technical courses (CTSP).

Higher Education

Higher education is provided by Polytechnic Institutes and Universities of a public, private, cooperative and concordat nature.

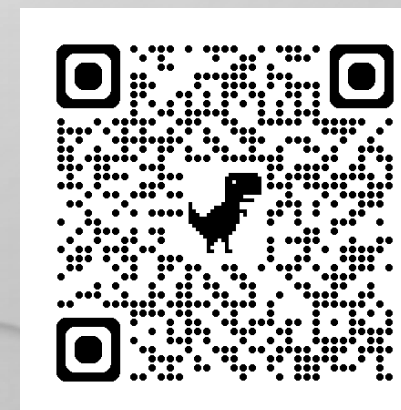
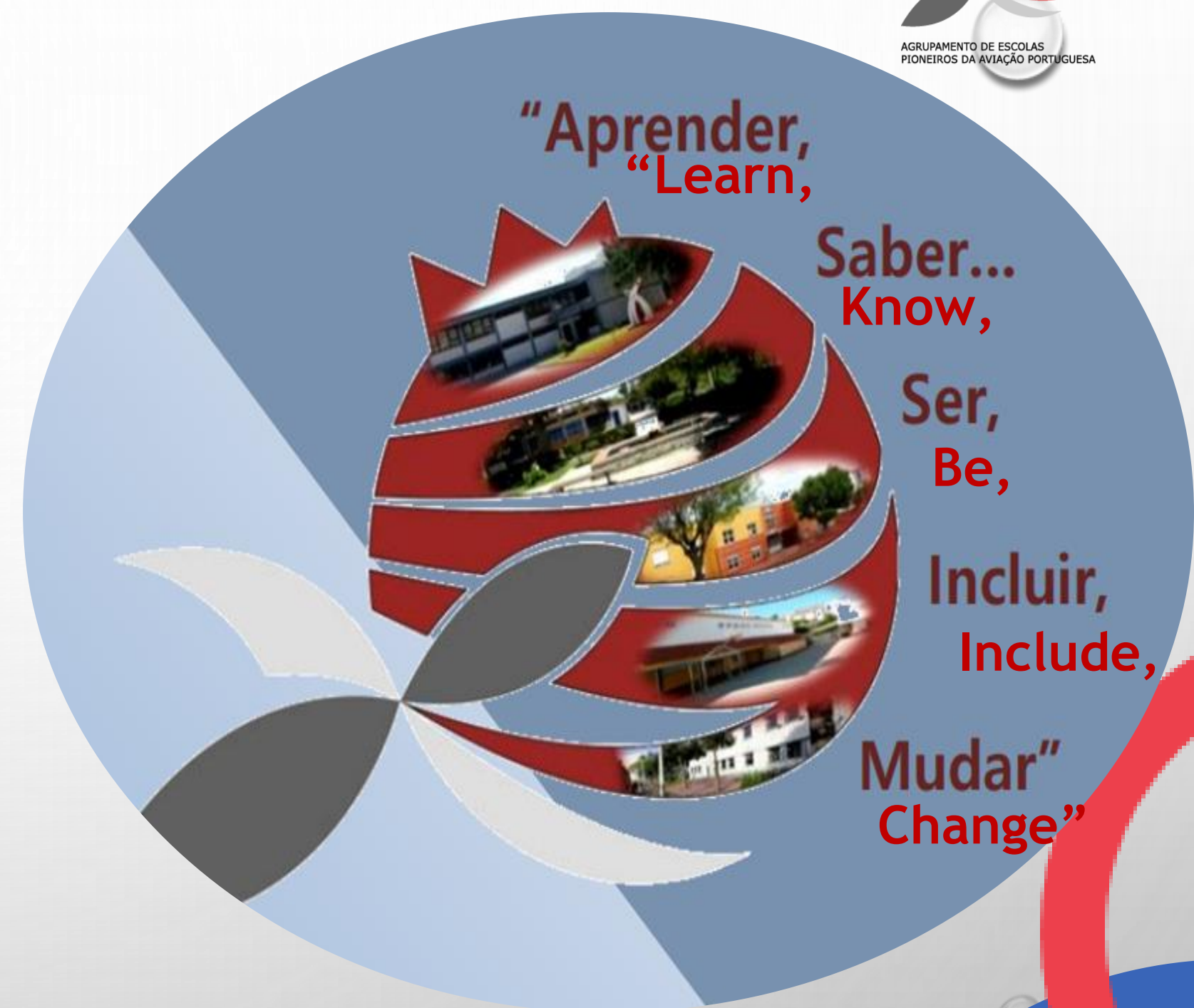


Here at *Agrupamento de Escolas Pioneiros da Aviação Portuguesa*, we want you to feel good and at home.

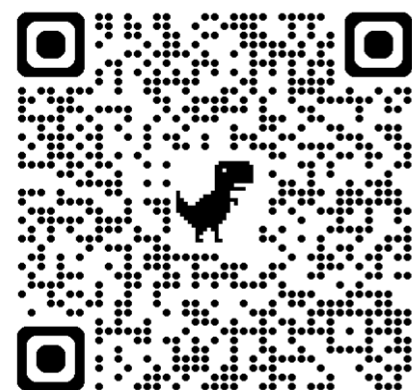
The headquarters are at the *Amadora Secondary School*, where the **administrative and management bodies** and **school administration services** operate.

Students' Rights



STUDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- be treated with respect by everyone and not be discriminated against on the grounds of ethnicity, health, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, economic, cultural or social status or political, ideological, philosophical or religious convictions;
- have their merit, dedication, attendance and effort recognised and valued;
- have their commitment to community actions recognised and encouraged;
- participate in curricular enrichment activities without prejudice to the regular timetable;
- benefit from the loan of textbooks according to the ASE level;
- have school insurance in accordance with current legislation;
- get specific support for their school or learning needs, including psychology and counselling services;
- have their safety at school guaranteed and their physical and moral integrity respected;
- get rapid assistance in the event of an accident or sudden illness during school activities;
- elect representatives to school bodies and positions, as well as be elected, in accordance with the law and internal regulations;
- be heard, through representatives, on matters that directly affect them;
- make criticisms and suggestions about the running of the school;
- use the bar, canteen, stationery and reprographics services in accordance with the regulations and established timetables;
- be assessed and self-assess with objectivity, impartiality and rigour;
- benefit from learning recovery measures in cases of justified absence.

Students' Duties



STUDENTS MUST:

- study and commit to their education and training;
- be assiduous, punctual, committed and responsible in school activities;
- keep to the school timetable and not leave class without authorisation;
- follow the teachers' instructions on teaching and learning;
- treat the entire educational community with respect and correctness, without using offensive words or gestures and not attacking peers, teachers or staff morally or physically;
- respect the authority and instructions of teachers and non-teaching staff;
- always carry their student ID card;
- bring the necessary school materials every day and keep them clean and organised;
- wear the proper equipment for Physical Education, including the school t-shirt in the 2nd and 3rd cycles;
- look clean and neat;
- wear clothing appropriate to the school environment and activities;
- preserve and keep spaces, teaching materials and furniture clean and tidy;
- comply with instructions to repair any damage caused; respect the operating rules of the services or areas they use;

Students' Duties



STUDENTS MUST:

- wait their turn to be served at any service (stationery, bar, canteen, school administration services, etc.);
- respect the property of all members of the educational community;
- be responsible for the possession and safekeeping of their property, aware that the school cannot be held responsible for loss, theft or damage;
- not possess nor consume addictive substances such as drugs or alcoholic beverages, or promoting trafficking, facilitating or consuming them;
- not carry materials, technological equipment, instruments or devices that could disrupt lessons or cause physical or psychological harm to any member of the school community;
- not use technological equipment, such as mobile phones or computer programmes, during lessons, training activities or school meetings, unless the use is directly related to the activity and authorised by the teacher or person in charge;
- repair any damage caused to any member of the educational community or to school equipment and facilities.

MISBEHAVIOUR THAT DISRUPTS THE NORMAL RUNNING OF ACTIVITIES IN THE SCHOOL, AS WELL AS NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THE RULES SET OUT IN THE STUDENT AND SCHOOL ETHICS STATUTE AND THE INTERNAL REGULATIONS, GIVE RISE TO DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS.

The Teachers

You may have many teachers at school, but one of them will be **your contact and proximity teacher** within the school, to whom you can and should turn whenever you need to.

- In **pre-school education**, it's the kindergarten teacher.
- In **primary school - 1st cycle**, it's your class teacher.
- In **2nd** and **3rd cycles** and **secondary education**, it's your headteacher.



Family at School

Your family is welcome at school!

The educator/class teacher/headteacher contacts the family to talk about your journey at school.

Your parent or guardian can also book a meeting during **parent's reception time** to answer any questions about your life at school.



The Parent's Role

Parents (or legal guardians) have the responsibility to monitor their pupils' education.

According to the Student's Statute, parents/guardians are obliged to:

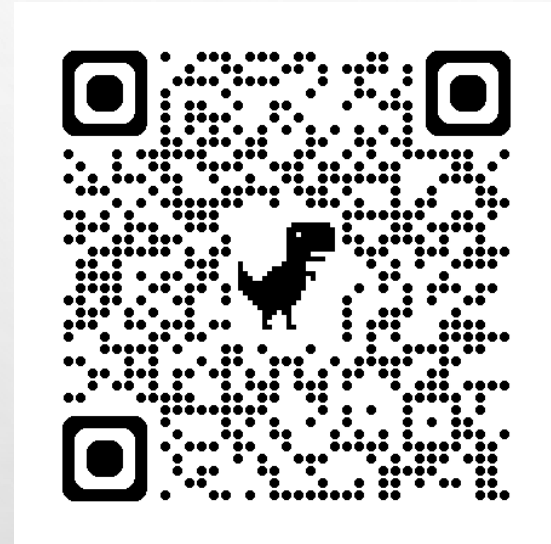
- be responsible for their pupils' duties, especially with regard to **attendance, punctuality and discipline**;
- promote the pupils' **respect** for teachers, colleagues, operational and technical assistants;
- monitor and collaborate in their pupils' education, **encouraging study** and the completion of **homework**;
- ensure that the rights and duties of the pupils are fulfilled;
- **come to school** whenever called upon.
